- WHEREAS: Again, complaints are being received about the noise level in Harvard Square and its environs, especially as it result from the presence of street musicians and transients with cassette recorders who frequent that area; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to direct the Chief of Police to review the present procedures for assuring that the level of sound coming from musical instruments, cassette recorders and other sources in the Square is in compliance with the City's noise ordinance and if the opposite be the case:
1. What is the rapidity of response for enforcing compliance and alleviating the presence of the violation?
 2. If the absence of a sufficient number of decibel meters for police personnel is part of the problem, then provision be made to acquire additional meters; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to report back to this City Council on this matter by November 13, 1989.
