- WHEREAS:** The City of Cambridge is currently developing a 55-acre recreational facility on the former city dump site, to be known as Thomas W. Danehy Park, which will substantially increase the available open space for athletic and leisure activities for all Cambridge residents; and
- WHEREAS:** The adjacent St. Peter's Field and Roethlisberger Park are in critical need of improvement to complement the full range of activities that will be offered at Danehy Park; and
- WHEREAS:** The City desires additional funding to renovate the existing playing areas at St. Peter's Field including new lighting, basketball courts, and a tot lot, as well as to construct a more serene setting at Roethlisberger Park through the installation of park benches, new walkways, trees, and grassy areas; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That application be submitted by the City of Cambridge to the Massachusetts Executive Office of Environmental Affairs, Division of Conservation Services for Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund and State Urban Self-Help financial assistance for St. Peter's Field and Roethlisberger Park; and be it further
- RESOLVED:** That the City Manager, or Deputy City Manager, or in their stead, the Assistant City Manager for Community Development is hereby authorized and directed to file such applications to make any amendments to the application or program proposed as may be necessary, to provide such additional information, furnish such documents, and execute such contracts as may be required, and to act as the authorized correspondent and representative of the City in connection with said application; and be it further
- RESOLVED:** That the U.S. Government, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the Division of Conservation Services be and hereby are assured of full compliance with all assurance and understandings as may be required.

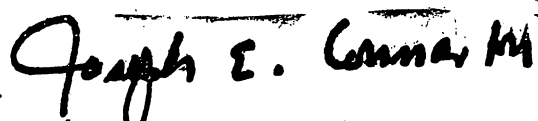
