Whereas, the premises described in the notice of Farwell J. Thayer, Martha A. Thayer, Fannie L. Derry, Hattie A. Thayer and Sarah B. Thayer, having been heretofore dedicated to public use as a way and the same having been uninterruptedly, openly and adversely used ~~used~~ by the public for a sufficient period to acquire an easement therein; therefore Resolved,

that the City does not admit that the said notice interferes with such public right, but denies that the parties notifying have the right to take away the same, ~~and~~ obstruct public travel over the premises.

Ordered, that this resolution be recorded in South Dist. of the Registry of Deeds for Middlesex

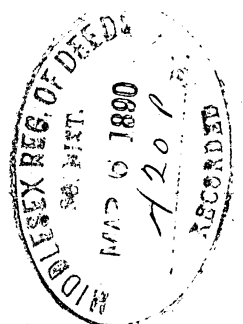

concerned.

Harwell J. Thayer, Martha A. Thayer, Fannie L. Derry, Mattie A. Thayer and Sarah B. Thayer of the City of Cambridge, in the County of Middlesex, and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, being the owners of a certain parcel of land, containing about ten thousand square feet, situate on the southerly side of Main Street, in Ward Four, in said City, and next easterly of the City Hall and bounded westerly by land of the said City, one hundred feet, northerly by said Main Street, one hundred feet, easterly by land of Ruth Charlotte Dana, one hundred feet, and southerly by land now or late of Green, Thwing, and others, one hundred feet, and being the same land which was conveyed to James H. and Joshua P. Thayer, by three several deeds of Elizabeth H. Dana, dated April 1st. 1845. August 1st. 1845. and December 9th. 1851. and recorded in said Middlesex Registry of Deeds. Book 450, Page 183. Book 463, Page 335. and Book 600, Page 593 respectively, and to prevent the said City of Cambridge from acquiring a right or privilege of way or other easement, by custom, use or otherwise, in, or over a part of said land, to wit, in, or over a strip thereof, on the northerly side, one hundred feet in length, and about fifteen feet in width, be the exact measures more or less, between the

front of the buildings standing thereon, and the northerly line of said parcel of land. We hereby give notice to said City of Cambridge, that we shall resist all such easement, or privilege of way, and that we intend to prevent said City of Cambridge from acquiring any such easement or privilege.
