It has come to the attention of this City Council that on Tuesday, September 28, 1976, His Excellency Bishop Thomas J. Riley D. D. retired as Pastor of Saint Peter's Church, and

WHEREAS:

Bishop Riley was first ordained into the priesthood in May of 1927, beginning what was to become a most successful religious career, and

WHEREAS:

Bishop Riley served as Rector of St. Johns Seminary just prior to being named Pastor of Saint Peter's Roman Catholic Church here in Cambridge, and

WHEREAS:

Then Monsignor Riley was appointed Titular Bishop of Regina in October of 1959 and consecrated as Auxiliary Bishop of Boston in December of that year, and

WHEREAS:

Bishop Riley was truly loved by his parishioners and the members of the clergy whose good fortune it was to have come into his contact and who on so many occasions sought the wise and scholarly advice of the Bishop, now therefore be it

That this City Council as assembled on Monday, October 4, 1976 does hereby extend our sincere best wishes to Bishop Riley as he retires from his Pastorate of 18 years, as well as from his position of Auxiliary Bishop of Boston, and be it further

That this City Council further extend our deepest gratitude to Bishop Riley for all his kindness which he has extended to this Council over the years, and be it further
