

In Board of Aldermen, Dec. 10, 1879.

The foregoing Ordinance is amended as follows:-

1
On page 57. by adding after the word "assessments" in the third line of section 6, the word "apportionments", and by adding, at the end of section 6, the words "He shall report to the City Treasurer all orders for Sewer and Sidewalk assessments, and all apportionments and abatements thereof, immediately after such orders are approved."

On page 57. in the 11th line from the bottom of the page, by striking out the words "Joint-Committee on roads and bridges" and inserting the words "Committee on roads and bridges of the board of Aldermen."

3
On page 62, by adding at the end of Section 17, the words "He shall annually, in December, report to the City Council a written statement in detail of receipts and expenditures for the year ending November 30th, and submit a copy thereof to the Finance Committee."

#4 ✓ On page 12. in the last-line of Section 20. by adding after the word "demand" the words "and no notice of opportunity made, a request- therefor, be filed in his office,".

5 ✓ On page 12. in the last-line on said page, by adding after the word "him", the words "and submit the same for approval to the proper board or committee named in section seven of this chapter"

6 ✓ On page 14. by transposing the last-line so as to read "The exterior brick walls of every building hereafter".

7 ✓ On page 17. in the 5th line, by inserting after the word "floor" the words "walls not-exceeding twelve feet-in height shall be not-less than eight-inches thick".

8 ✓ Also by striking out in the eighth line on said page 17. the words "and more than thirty feet-in height".

Also by adding at the end of the tenth line on said page 17. the words "and no chimney shall be supported on a post or column, except by special permission of the City Engineer"

On page 68. by numbering sections 10 and 11 as ~~11~~ 11 and 12. and by inserting after the second line on said page 68. a new section as follows:-

"Sect. 10. No buildings now erected, or hereafter to be erected, shall be altered, raised, roofed, enlarged, or otherwise built-upon, in any manner contrary to the terms of this ordinance."

On pages 69 and 70. by striking out sections 5, 6, 7, and the first-paragraph of section 8. as far as the words "The Compensation" &c. and by adding a new section as follows:-
"Sect. 5. For services rendered in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, an undertaker shall be entitled to receive the following fees, and no more, to wit:-

For a hearse with one horse, five dollars; with two horses, six dollars. For services of himself and of his assistants at the house, and in carrying the body from the house to the grave or tomb. - for a person twelve years of age and upwards, four dollars; for a person less than twelve years of age, two dollars and

fifty cents.

✓ In carrying a body out-of the city he shall be allowed, in addition, fifty cents for every mile which he shall carry the same beyond the limits of the city.

On page 99. by adding after the word "Auditors" at the end of Section 3. the words "He shall annually, in the month of December, present to the City Council a report showing the detailed expenses, the material used other property on hand, the number of lamps in the City, and other facts in relation to his department."

On page 100. by striking out the 7th, 8th and 9th lines at the top of the page, and inserting the following words:

"He shall have charge of all printed matter, bound volumes, and books of reference, belonging to the City, and not turned over to the departments, and shall distribute the same or keep them in convenient form for reference, according to such rules as the standing

Committee on Stationery and Printing shall adopt. He shall report to the City Council annually, in December, giving a general statement of purchases, deliveries, and stock on hand, also a catalogue of all additions to the reference library".

Con page 100 - Chapter 22. by adding at the end of the first section, the words - "The office-hours for city employees shall be fixed by the board, committee, or board of departments, authorized to employ them".

Sect. 1. In the month of January, in the year eighteen hundred and eighty, and every third year thereafter, there shall be appointed by the mayor, with the approval of the board of aldermen, a city physician, who shall hold office for a term of three years from the first Monday in February next succeeding his appointment. He shall be subject to removal for cause by the same authority. A vacancy shall be immediately filled in like manner at any time for the unexpired term. He shall be *ex officio* a member of the board of health, and his salary shall be fixed by the city council at a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars per annum.

Sect. 2. He shall, in addition to his duties as a member of said Board, be the almshouse physician, and, under the direction of the Overseers of the Poor, shall visit, and prescribe for, all the sick poor within the limits of the city.

Sect. 3. He shall also vaccinate, free of charge, all persons sent to him by the Overseers of the Poor, and such scholars of the public schools, as the school committee shall direct.

Sect. 4. He shall be one of the consulting physicians in examinations of the insane poor, and shall also render all services incumbent upon him by the laws of the State, or the ordinances of the city.

Sect. 5. He shall, when requested by the Mayor, Board of Aldermen, or Chief of Police, examine all candidates for appointment upon the police force; the condition of

all officers absent from duty; all cases of injury whereby the city may become liable; and all causes of death of persons dying with no physician in attendance.

Sect. 6. He shall, at the request of the Chief of Police, attend all prisoners in the police stations who require medical, or surgical, treatment.

Sect. 7. He shall annually, in the month of December, submit to the City Council a report giving a general statement of the amount of professional service rendered by him, with such suggestions as he may deem proper.

Sect. 8. The salary of the city physician shall be fixed by the city Council at a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars per annum.

new Sect 8 He shall have power to depute to an assistant, subject to the confirmation of the Mayor and Aldermen, such part of his duties as seem best for efficient administration of his office, without any additional salary; but he shall in all cases be responsible for the conduct of his assistant.

On page 102. in chapter 26, by striking
out the 18th section, and inserting the

Sec 1. The police department shall consist of a
chief of police, three captains of police, one for
each police district, one captain of night police,
six sergeants of police, and such number of
detectives and policemen as the board of aldermen
with the approval of the mayor shall deem
necessary.

Their appointment shall be made in the following
manner, namely; the mayor first nominating
them for their respective ranks, and the
concurrence in the same by the board of aldermen;
and they shall severally hold their respective
offices until removed by the mayor and aldermen.

The following qualifications shall be
necessary for any one to become eligible as a
member of the police department:-

He shall be a citizen of the United States,
a resident of Cambridge and a tax-payer therein
for at least three years next preceeding his
appointment; - not less than twenty five years
nor over fifty years of age at the time of his
appointment; not less than five feet and seven
inches in height, of sound health and vigor,
of temperate and industrious habits, good moral
character, courteous and respectful deportment,
and shall be judicious, energetic and courageous.

The members of the police department shall perform all duties required of them as day and night police in accordance with the ordinances of the city, and the laws of the state, and shall conform to all rules and regulations which are or may be prescribed by the mayor and board of aldermen. They shall receive such compensation for their service as the city council may from time to time determine.

No private drain shall be entered into any main drain or sewer or into any private drain connected with any public sewer, without a permit in writing from the City Engineer; and on the completion of the work, the permit shall be returned to the office of the City Engineer, inclosed by the owner of the drain with a statement of his proceedings thereunder.

The City Engineer is authorized to grant such permits for estates which abut on the sewer into which an entrance is desired.

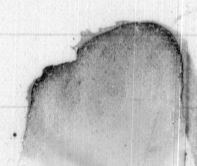
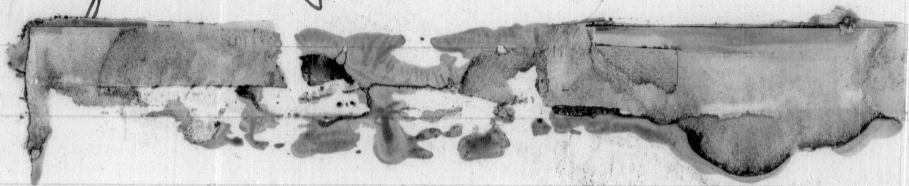
Each permit shall be subject to the provision of the ordinance and shall state in detail the premises to which it applies, the time, place, manner, and construction of such entrance.

Each permit may, at the discretion of the City Engineer, be subject to the condition that such entrance be made in the presence of an inspector appointed by the City Engineer.

No private drain from an estate not already assessed, or not liable to assessment for the cost of the sewer, shall be entered into such sewer, except upon the consent of the Mayor and Aldermen.

The report of the Joint-Committee on Public Property shall contain a description of all real estates belonging to the City."
