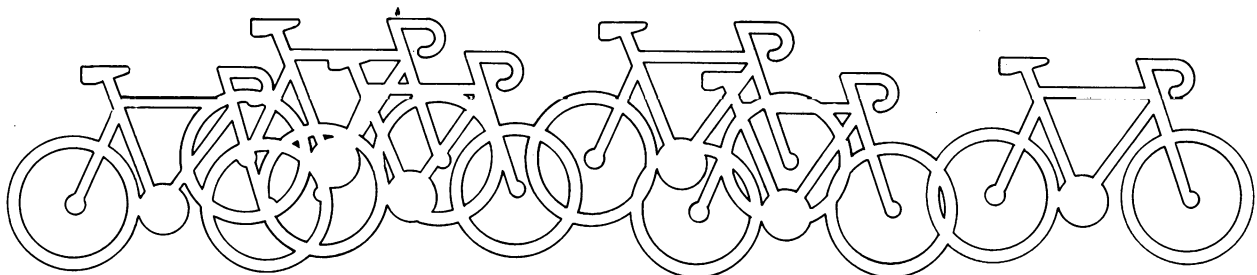

To The Honorable The City Council,

The Boston Area Bicycle Coalition, a local non-profit organization of cyclists created to promote the safe use of bicycles for transportation and recreation purposes, is planning to hold the third annual Bicycle Fair as part of Bike Day '80 on Sunday, June 8, 1980. This year the event is being sponcered by Star Market in conjunction with their fund raising efforts for the Special Olympics.

The events for Bike Day '80 will begin with the gathering of bicycle riders at various Star Market locations for regestration and bicycle safety inspections. From these locations the the cyclists will proceed to Boston Common for a short rally. From Boston Common the bicycle riders will form a procession and travel down Commonwealth Avenue to the B.U. Bridge, to Memorial Drive and finally to the Fair site at Riverbend Park. In addition to Riverbend Park the Fair site will include Flagg Street and the Corporal Burns Playground. We have applied for and/or received permits for the closing of Flagg Street, the use of the sidewalks on Flagg Street and the use of the playground.

ORDERED: That this permit is granted subject to the conditions which may be required by the Commission of Public Works.
