Harry A. Parris, a member of the Rindge Technical School Faculty for thirty-two years, departed this life on October 15, 1970 at the age of sixty-one years, and

WHEREAS:-

Harry A. Parris was a graduate of Cambridge High and Latin School, Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1931 and the recipient of a Master of Education degree at Harvard University and was an outstanding physics teacher who received the Valley Forge Freedom Foundation Classroom Teacher Medal in 1963 and was a member of the Physical Science Study Committee in the Greater Boston area and in that capacity participated in the development of a physics science curriculum with Massachusetts Institute of Technology Professor Jerrold R. Zacharias, and

WHEREAS:-

His ability in the field of physical science led to his selection by the United States Government as their representative at the National Science Foundation Institute at Chofu, Japan during the summer of 1964, and

WHEREAS:-

Mr. Parris was recognized in his profession not only as an outstanding classroom teacher, but made his greatest contribution as a teacher of teachers in the field of physics, and was selected by the Raytheon Company to direct an orientation program for their personnel and was active in planning innovations in science training for the Educational Development Corporation, therefore be it
