- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Raymond P. Connerty, a Cambridge native and a career Middlesex County employee; and
- WHEREAS: Ray, having attended local schools, went on to attend both Catholic and Fordham Universities and upon graduation began a teaching career with the Xavierian Teaching Order of Brothers, a profession he continued for several years; and
- WHEREAS: Ray was appointed the First Assistant Chief Probation Officer of the Cambridge District Court in 1943, a position he not only held for thirty-one years, but one for which he was extremely qualified and demonstrated an amazing ability to deal with youths and adolescents; and
- WHEREAS: Upon Ray's retirement from probation work, he joined the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy and became the housefather of Loretto Hall, retiring in 1983; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Norma Connerty and to the entire family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.
