- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Francis E. Powers, a native Cantabrigian and retired Cambridge Police Officer; and
- WHEREAS: Frank attended local schools and served his country during World War II as a member of the United States Navy and later was appointed to the Cambridge Police Department in 1945 and served the Department and the people of Cambridge for thirty-three years prior to his retirement in 1978; and
- WHEREAS: Frank, although holding various assignments within the Department during his long career, the ones he truly enjoyed were those involving foot patrol, because he felt that was the best way to know the community and be recognized by the neighborhoods as "their" police officer; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Dorothy Powers and to the entire family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Powers on behalf of the entire City Council.
