The Cambridge Council of Realtors has adopted the Salvation Army's Our Place Day Care Center for Homeless Children as the focus of its yearly fund-raising efforts. This year the realtors donated \$15,000; over the past four years, a total of \$63,000 has been raised.

Run by the Salvation Army, the goal of Our Place is to break the cycle of homelessness by freeing a parent during the day for training or work. Twenty-six children from homeless shelters throughout the city arrive daily at Our Place. These young children are fed and nurtured in a caring, structured environment. For several hours a day, Our Place is their only home.

"When they come to us, they are often frightened and very insecure," said Major Stephen Carroll of the Salvation Army. "But they soon develop a sense of trust and confidence. In 10 years, no child has had to repeat the Our Place program."

Carroll said Our Place has come to depend on the Cambridge realtors.

"Were it not for their generosity, we could not keep our doors completely open," he said.

Each year local business professionals and citizens have joined realtors' efforts with their financial support or by offering gifts to be raffled.

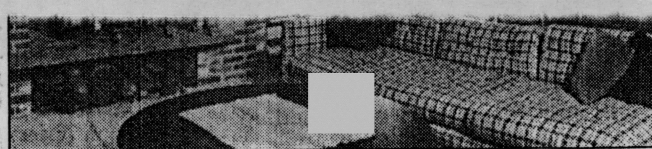
