- WHEREAS: Mr. Storer was a descendant of Robert Treat Paine a signer of the Declaration of Independence, and
- WHEREAS: Mr. Storer, being a graduate of Harvard University Class of 1918, was a longtime Cantabrigian and a great benefactor to civic groups and youth organizations, particularly to the Cambridge Boy Scouts whom he served as President for 13 years and to whom he graciously donated some 180 acres of property in Rindge, New Hampshire, now therefore be it
