The Joint Committee on Roads and Bridges, which was instructed by an Order of Jan'y 29th to consider and report what repairs are necessary to render River Street, between Fremont Street and the Brighton Bridge, safe for travel, would respectfully

Report: That by the Statutes of the Commonwealth and the Ordinances of the City, "the general care and charge of the highways, streets, lanes, sidewalks, and bridges, of the City, the making, amending and alteration thereof, and the keeping of them in good repair so as to be safe and convenient for travellers, with their horses, teams, and carriages, at all seasons of the year", are under the direction and control of the Surveyors of Highways, or a Committee of such Board.

As this subject has been brought to the attention of the Surveyors of Highways, the Committee would ask to be discharged from the further consideration of the same.
