WHEREAS: Jobs for Bay State Graduates, Inc. has provided their important service since 1980 when it became apparent that students who enter the workforce need more than job placement, but also other forms of encouragement; and

WHEREAS: Cambridge Rindge and Latin School students are part of the Bay State Graduates network, which, as of June of 1989, has served over seven thousand students with an impressive placement rate of nearly ninety per cent; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council proclaims the month of March 1991 "Career Association Month" and urge students of Cambridge Rindge and Latin School, both in and out of the Bay State Graduates program, to celebrate the success of classmates who choose careers upon graduation; and be it further

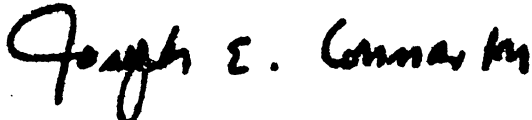

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Chapter 2.110

TRAFFIC

CITY-OWNED LAND AND BUILDINGS

Sections:

2.110.010 Sale, lease or rental procedures.**2.110.010 Sale, lease or rental procedures.**

A. For the purposes of protecting the citizens of Cambridge, real estate values and obtaining the best possible land use, no sale, lease or rental by the City of Cambridge of City-owned land or ways shall be accomplished until such offer, when received by the City Council, shall be referred to the Planning Board of the City for

study and a report made to the City Council, which shall hold a public hearing to which the Planning Board shall be invited. The hearing shall be held within one month after receipt of the Planning Board's report to the City Council.

B. At least ten days prior to the hearing the City Clerk shall post notices of the hearing upon the City-owned land or ways with respect to the proposed sale, lease or rental and shall send a written notice to the owners of the property adjoining and opposite such land or ways within two hundred feet thereof as shown on the most recent tax list of the Board of Assessors, and to such owners and civic groups as may be deemed by the City Clerk to be affected and shall publish notice of the hearing in newspapers of general circulation within the City. 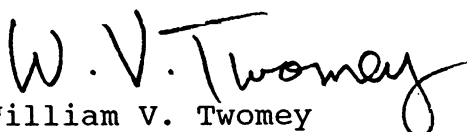
