WHEREAS: Cambridge is in the midst of celebrating its 150th Anniversary as an incorporated city; and

WHEREAS: 150 years ago the Irish continent was decimated by a famine that left one million people dead in Ireland and resulted in involuntary exiling many Irish citizens; and

WHEREAS: Many of these exiled sons and daughters of Ireland arrived in Cambridge to build a new life for themselves and their families; and

WHEREAS: This great wave of Irish immigration helped to shape the character and destiny of our city, state and nation; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council support the efforts of the Cambridge Celtic Arts Society to direct a fitting monument memorializing the sacrifices in contribution of the victims of the Irish Famine by locating an appropriate memorial on the Cambridge Common in the area along Garden Street and Appian Way; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the matter be referred to the City Manager to take appropriate action.
