WHEREAS: An integral part of the Constitution of the United States espouses the belief that all people are created equal, therefore equal treatment is their inalienable right; and

WHEREAS: The twenty sixth anniversary of the National Fair Housing Law Title III of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, commemorated during the month of April, is a time for all citizens to commit themselves to the fundamental principles of freedom of choice; and

WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge's Fair Housing Ordinance has substantial remedies for victims of discrimination; and

WHEREAS: The Cambridge Human Rights Commission has been granted substantial equivalency by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), and this designation provides the Commission to act as an agent of the federal government in the investigation and resolution of housing discrimination complaints within Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: Cambridge is one of the few municipalities in the country given substantial equivalency authority, this designation traditionally being given to state and federal agencies; and

WHEREAS: The Human Rights Commission and the Cambridge Community Housing Resource Board, a fair housing consortium, will conduct a media campaign during the month of April promoting the fact that all Americans are entitled to equality and freedom in the selection of housing; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council does hereby proclaim April 1994 as Fair Housing Month in the City of Cambridge and designate the Cambridge Human Rights Commission the official sponsor of activities in the city promoting this named month; and be it further

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council urge all citizens to reaffirm and intensify their identification with the objectives of fair housing.

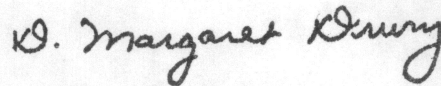
