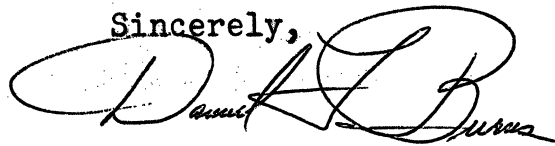

I have taken up your letter of June 24, 1970, and the accompanying City Council Order concerning the meeting for the purpose of discussing and implementing our Modernization Program with the Members of our Authority. It was the general consensus of all the Members of the Authority that inasmuch as this matter originated with the City Demonstration Agency, it should be worked out cooperatively between the Authority and the C.D.A.

Consequently, I have had a meeting with Mr. Robert Williams, Executive Director of the C.D.A., and he has expressed a willingness to sit down with the Authority. We believe that the best good will be accomplished by such a meeting with direct connections with HUD to the end that proper staffing, which we have continually requested, will be forthcoming, to move forward with our Modernization Program.

MODERNIZATION PROGRAM

File 6

1. The first step in the modernization program is to establish a central planning agency. This agency will be responsible for coordinating all government activities and for setting priorities for the development of the country.

2. The second step is to improve the educational system. This will involve increasing the number of schools and teachers, and improving the quality of the curriculum.

3. The third step is to improve the health care system. This will involve building more hospitals and clinics, and training more health care workers. It will also involve improving the sanitation and hygiene of the population.

4. The fourth step is to improve the transportation system. This will involve building more roads and bridges, and improving the efficiency of the public transport system. It will also involve improving the infrastructure for air and sea transport.

5. The fifth step is to improve the communication system. This will involve building more telephones and telegraph lines, and improving the efficiency of the postal service.

6. The sixth step is to improve the housing system. This will involve building more houses and improving the quality of the existing housing stock.
