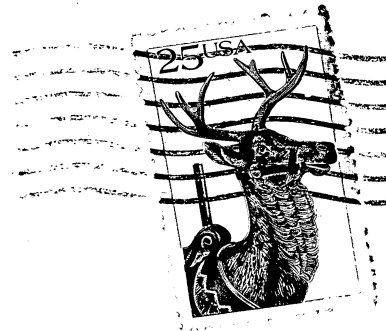
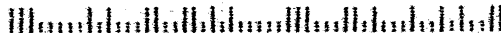

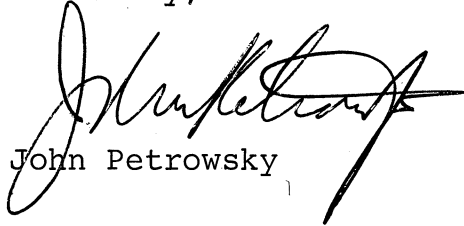

We, the undersigned, in the interest of the tax payers and the citizens of Cambridge, petition the City Council and the Rent Control Board to revise present law so that in future, all damages, awards, and financial benefits resulting from rent-controlled tenant grievances against landlords be paid not to the tenant but to the FUND FOR THE HOMELESS. This payment would be comprised of any amount over the actual rent-controlled rent allowed. The purpose of this revision would be to discourage tenants from entering less than bona fide agreements with homeowners, only to sue the landlords just prior to quitting premises at termination of lease. This will ensure that the homeless of the city benefit from the exorbitant "damages" being paid to persons who are often financially better off than the homeowners.
