Increase the number and diversity of community residents informed and involved in urban and community forestry endeavors;

Establish new and strengthen existing urban and community forestry programs in municipalities and other jurisdictions;

Promote increased self-reliance and support at all levels for urban and community forestry programs; and

WHEREAS: The Cambridge Tree Project has the following two objectives in pursuing "Urban Forestry and Education" grant funding:

1. Tree Awareness and Education. The Cambridge Tree Project will involve a diverse cross-section of local residents, policy makers and educators to increase the public's awareness of the economic, environmental, social and physical health benefits of trees in the urban environment.
2. Develop a Local Tree Ordinance for Cambridge. The Cambridge Tree Project will work with a diverse cross-section of government representatives and local residents from all the neighborhoods to develop a local tree ordinance for Cambridge based on model ordinances from comparable communities throughout the country; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record encouraging and supporting the Cambridge Tree Project in its application for an "Urban Forestry and Education" grant.

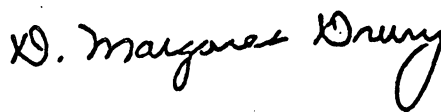
