# CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN COMMON COUNCIL, NOV. 23, 1870.

The foregoing Ordinances are amended as follows, viz:—

In Chapter 1. Sec. 4. By striking out the word "Reservoirs" wherever it occurs, and inserting the word "Sewers."

In Chapter 18. By numbering Sections 9 and 10, as 10 and 11 respectively, and by inserting as Section 9 the following, viz:—

"The Mayor and Alderman shall appoint a Captain of Night Police, whose duties shall be prescribed by the Chief of Police, subject to the approval of the Mayor: who shall have precedence and control over all police officers other than the three Principal Constables, and who shall receive the same compensation as the other policemen, as provided in Section 2 of this chapter.

In Chapter 19. By altering the salary of the Mayor from \$3,000, to "Twenty-five hundred dollars.

By altering the salary of the City Engineer from \$2,500, to "Three thousand dollars."

By altering the salary of the Chief Engineer from \$600 to "Eight hundred dollars." And by adding the words, "And that of the Sealer of Weights and Measures, which shall not commence until the day last mentioned."

In Chapter 23. By striking out the word "Reservoirs" in Sections 4, 5 and 6, and substituting therefor the word "Sewers."

In Chapter 29, Section 23, by striking out the first six lines, under the head of "Manufactories," as also the word "Manufactories," by numbering Sections 24 and 25 as Nos. 25 and 26, and by inserting as Section 24 the following, viz:—

"When large quantities are required, as in case of Railroads, Hotels, Manufacturing, and other establishments, the Water Board shall have power to ascertain by meters the amount of water used.

And the proprietors or occupants of Hotels, Taverns, Boarding Houses, or any other establishments using large quantities of water, shall also have authority to place within their premises, at their own expense, a sufficient Water Meter, to be approved by the Water Registrar, for the purpose of measuring the quantity of water by them respectively used.

The charge for the use of water by meter shall be three cents for each one hundred gallons."

As amended, passed to be enrolled, and sent up for concurrence.

Concurred in the Amendments proposed by the Common Council, except those relating to Chapter 28<sup>th</sup> sections 23<sup>rd</sup>, <sup>24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup></sup> for which the following is substituted: -

In said Chapter, in page 87<sup>th</sup> -

Strike out the word "manufactures" and the words "and for" for which last substitute the word "For".

Also strike out the words "but no meter shall be applied on the use of any discontinue, without the approval of the Board" and insert in place thereof the following: -

"and in any case, where the quantity used averages not less than five hundred gallons per day, a meter shall be applied if the proprietors or occupants request it; and the charge for the water used shall be at the rate of three cents for each one hundred gallons"
