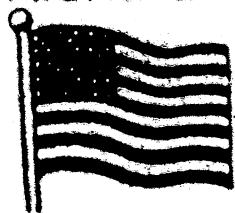

► **Rents frozen:** Not all landlords are taking advantage of the end of rent control.

The Boston-based Samia Companies, which claims to be the largest owner of multi- and single-family housing in the city, has frozen rents for the elderly and disabled in units that had been subsidized.

Chief executive Leonard J. Samia said there will be no increase in rents for the next 24 months for the elderly and disabled who lost their protection when rent control expired. After two years, each tenant's situation will be evaluated case by case. Samia said about 24 of the company's 1,800 units will be affected by the reprieve.

He is hoping to set an example for other landlords in Boston, Brookline and Cambridge.
