WHEREAS: Fred was also well known for his civic activities; he served on the Democratic City Committee, the Mid-Cambridge Neighborhood Association and on the board of the Cambridge Mental Health Association; and

WHEREAS: Fred's passing will leave a void in the lives of all of his surviving friends and family, his wife Lucia (Antonioli); his children Meredith MacKay-Smith, Robin Henderson, Tamson Conrad and Christopher Currier Stone; his stepchildren Lisa Tanner Bercaw and Matthew Hausman; and his eleven grandchildren; and

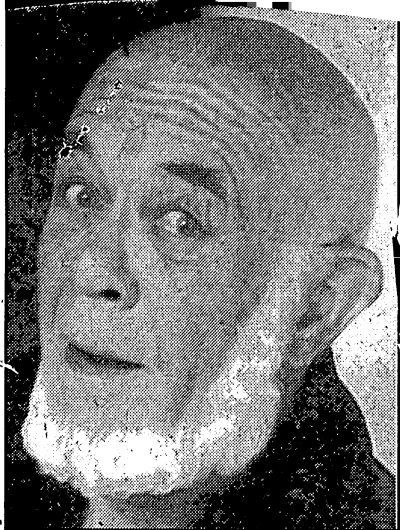

Frederick M. Stone died March 4, 1997 at home in Cambridge. He was 76.

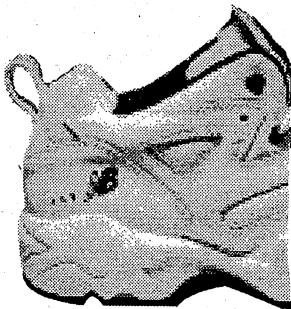
