A funeral Mass will be said tomorrow for Thomas J. Lambert, assistant special agent in charge of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms, Boston Field Division, who died Saturday of cancer. He was 51.

A native of Cincinnati, Mr. Lambert graduated from Purcell High School and received a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from the University of Cincinnati in 1972. He also earned an MBA from National-Louis University in Evanston, Ill., in 1996.
