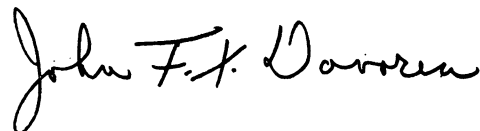

1. The name by which the corporation shall be known is:

BRICKLAYERS AND MASONS UNION #3 EDUCATIONAL CORPORATION ✓

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

This corporation is created and shall be operated exclusively for non-profit, charitable, educational, civic and community welfare purposes in the general public interest. It shall be the particular object and purpose of this corporation to create, participate in and assist in all ways permissible by law in affirmatively effecting employment and apprentice and journeymen training and educational opportunities for members of the general public, minority groups, and members of Bricklayers and Masons Union #3 in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. No part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation or intervention in any political campaign.

No part of the net earnings of this corporation shall inure to the benefit of any private individual or officer or member of the corporation. In the event of dissolution, the corporation's property shall be applied to charitable or non-profit purposes in accordance with the doctrine of cy pres in all respects, and under no circumstances shall any remaining income or corpus of any funds be returned to or revest, or paid over to any officer of the corporation, but said funds shall be expended for sole purpose of providing welfare or other benefits to the members of the Union.

NOTE: If provisions for which the space provided under Articles 2, 4, 5 and 6 is not sufficient additions should be set out on continuation sheets to be numbered 2A, 2B, etc. Indicate under each Article where the provision is set out. Continuation sheets shall be on 8 1/2" x 11" paper and must have a left-hand margin 1 inch wide for binding. Only one side should be used.

Except as otherwise required by law, this Agreement of Association and Articles of Organization of the corporation may be amended from time to time by the affirmative vote of at least a majority of the members, provided that no amendment shall authorize or permit the corporation to be operated otherwise than exclusively for such educational, scientific, or charitable purposes as qualify the corporation for exemption from taxation under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as now in force of hereafter amended.
