Christina M. (Courtney) Markey of Malden, mother of U.S. Rep. Edward J. Markey of Malden, died Wednesday at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston.

Born in Malden, she attended Immaculate Conception Grammar School and Girls' Catholic High School, where she was senior class president. Before her graduation from high school, she assumed the role of homemaker for her three younger sisters after her mother's death.

After her marriage to John E. Markey, Mrs. Markey dedicated herself to the education and upbringing of her three sons.

She was a dedicated member of the Immaculate Conception Church in Malden.

In addition to her husband and her son, Mrs. Markey is survived by two other sons, Richard P. of Charlestown and John K. of Belmont; two sisters, Catherine Courtney of Cambridge and Wilmington
