In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred
and Sixty-seven.

An Ordinance

In further addition to "An Ordinance providing for a division of the City of Cambridge into Five Wards, and for determining the boundaries thereof, and the number of members of the Common Council which each Ward shall be entitled to elect."

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

Sect. 1. The number of the Wards of the City, for the next five years, shall be five; and the boundaries of the several Wards shall continue the same as now established.

Sect. 2. Ward Number One shall elect four members of the Common Council; Ward Number Two shall elect five members of the Common Council; Ward Number Three shall elect five members of the Common Council; Ward Number Four shall elect four members of the Common

Council; Ward Number Five shall elect
two members of the Common Council.

Sec. 3. All Ordinances and parts of
Ordinances inconsistent herewith are
hereby repealed.
