To The Honourable

The undersigned would respectfully represent — —
that during the latter part of last year, he was —
awarded a sum in compensation for damage ~~done~~
his estate on Watson St by reason of the laying
out of the same, entirely inadequate to satisfy the
expenses necessary to be incurred in the moving —
of his building, that he had been led to expect —
an additional award, until the time for appeal —
to the County Commissioners, had expired, has more
recently petitioned the City Council for a further
consideration of the same, that he understands his case
rests contingent upon the report of a special committee
upon a matter of similar character on Lincoln Street,
that he has received notice under date of Sept 25th / 1874 —

To remove his building within 15 days or suffer the cutting off
of the same to a line with the street, wherefore he prays that
there may be a stay to such proceedings until his petition
shall receive a final determination
