WHEREAS: In 1994, an estimated 182,000 women in the United States will be diagnosed with breast cancer; and

WHEREAS: One out of every eight women will contract breast cancer in her lifetime; and

WHEREAS: This disease will take the lives of 46,000 American women this year, 4,900 of the deaths in Massachusetts alone; and

WHEREAS: Carol Sacco, a mammography technician at The Cambridge Hospital, has long planned a fund-raiser to help the many patients she sees each year at the Hospital; and

WHEREAS: Carol Sacco herself has recently been diagnosed with breast cancer; and

WHEREAS: The first annual "Friends Who Care . . . for people living with breast cancer" fund raiser will take place on June 26, 1994 from noon until 6 o'clock p.m. at the Lohnes estate overlooking Good Harbor Beach in Gloucester, Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS: Proceeds from the fund raiser, which is being sponsored by the Friends Who Care Foundation in association with the American Cancer Society, are to be used for patient services, and will benefit the American Cancer Society, The Cambridge Hospital, and the Mount Auburn Hospital, where Carol Sacco is undergoing treatment; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council does hereby proclaim Sunday, the twenty-sixth of June, 1994 to be

CAROL SACCO DAY

throughout the City of Cambridge; and be it further

RESOLVED: That all Cambridge residents are encouraged to support this fund raiser and to work for greater awareness of the danger of breast cancer in our society.
