PRESS RELEASE

One of the largest service expansion projects in New England Telephone History, costing more than \$56 million, is underway in the City of Cambridge.

Under construction and near completion is a new six story building located on Bent Street in the Kendall Square section of Cambridge which will house the most sophisticated call-switching equipment in the Bell System. Underground construction work associated with the service to this building has been in progress for more than a year. This work comprises of a conduit network to interconnect this network with the entire Bell System.

Current street work in the City of Cambridge involve the installation of conduit in many streets and therefore causing an inconvenience to many drivers. I am asking the motorists cooperation in having a little patience and where possible to avoid these streets until this conduit is installed.

The streets that will be affected are the following:

1. Mass. Ave. from Remington St. to Bow Street
2. DeWolfe St. from Mass. Ave. to Mt. Auburn Street
3. Mt. Auburn St. from DeWolfe St. to Boylston Street
4. Main St. from Longfellow Bridge to Broadway
5. Broadway from Third St. to Ellery Street
6. Third St. from Bent St. to Cambridge Street
