- WHEREAS: In spite of the best efforts to grapple with a very complicated and lengthy proposal in a marathon and exhausting series of meetings held over the past two weeks under the time constraints imposed on the Tenant Council, Council, Subcommittees, and the residents by the Cambridge Housing Authority (CHA) and the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) deadline, they are unable to evaluate the draft Cambridge Housing Authority Proposal constructively and comprehensively; and
- WHEREAS: They are in basic agreement on the overall goal of comprehensive modernization, they have a number of important reservations about the proposed design and proposed relocation plan, as well as other matters which they shall submit in a separate letter; and
- WHEREAS: For those reasons, the Tenant Council does not find itself able to vote in an informed manner at the present time to approve or disapprove the Proposal for Comprehensive Modernization of Washington Elms -- a matter of vital importance to our lives-- prior to the submission deadline of June 26, 1980; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge Housing Authority Proposal for Comprehensive Modernization of Washington Elms be submitted to the Cambridge Housing Authority Board and to the Housing and Urban Development on June 26, 1980 without a recommendation for approval by the Washington Elms Tenants Council; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That a letter outlining the position of the residents be drafted by the Washington Elms Tenants Council for submission to the Cambridge Housing Authority Board and to the Housing and Urban Development.
