- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to instruct the Police Chief, Fire Chief, Director of Traffic and Parking, License Commission and the Public Works Commissioner to make the appropriate arrangements to allow John F. Kennedy Street to be closed between Mt. Auburn Street to Brattle and Brattle Street as far as Brattle Square on Sunday, October 12, 1986 in order for the Harvard Square Business Association to participate in the "Oktoberfest", (raindate of Sunday, October 19, 1986); and be it further
- ORDERED: That the Chief of Police be and hereby is authorized to issue a permit for the sale of food, beverages and merchandise so that the Business Association can comply with the Massachusetts laws on the required date; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the Commissioner of Public Works be and hereby is authorized to issue a sidewalk sales permit; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the Health Department be and hereby is requested to issue a permit for the sale of food and beverages outdoors.

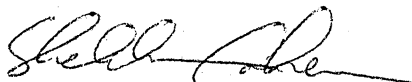
On behalf of the Harvard Square Business Association, I would respectfully request permission for our organization to sponsor its eighth annual Oktoberfest in Harvard Square from noon to dusk on Sunday, October 12 (raindate: Sunday, October 19), albeit without asking the City Council to grant us or to extend a special one-day license to sell wine and/or beer to any of our participating merchants this year.

Our decision to make all outdoor events sponsored by the Business Association alcohol-free and as trouble-free as possible is based on a consensus among our members regarding our responsibilities and liabilities as a non-profit organization primarily concerned with improving Harvard Square as a desirable place of business and as a mecca for people of all ages.

I trust that the City Council will favorably consider our special request at its next meeting. In sponsoring the Oktoberfest, the Harvard Square Business Association would need the cooperation of city officials to close off JFK Street from Mount Auburn Street to Brattle, and Brattle Street as far as Brattle Square from 10 a.m. until 7:30 p.m. on the date of the Oktoberfest. We plan to work with Inspectional Services, the Police Department, Public Works, and the Traffic Department to organize a street fair on Brattle and JFK streets and to broadcast Bavarian music from the bandstand at that intersection from noon until dusk.

Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
