- WHEREAS: Artist Juliet Appleby Kepes died unexpectedly of heart failure on April 11, 1999, and to pay tribute to her memory, friends and family invite the Cambridge community to celebrate Juliet Kepes' extraordinary life at The Bunting Institute at Radcliffe College on Sunday, May 9, from 11 a.m. - 1 p.m.; and
- WHEREAS: Juliet Kepes was a well known artist, writer and illustrator of children's books who lived in Cambridge for fifty-three years; and
- WHEREAS: Juliet Kepes received many awards for her work, including a Caldicott Medal of Honor for children's books, an award from the New York Times for the best illustrated book of the year 1969, a citation of merit from the Society of Illustrators, a certificate of excellence from the American Institute of Graphic Arts and awards from the Museum of Modern Art in New York for textiles and pictures for children; and
- WHEREAS: Cambridge is fortunate to have two public artworks by Juliet Kepes that have recently been restored by the Cambridge Arts Council, including five bronze birds in the Clarendon Avenue Park in North Cambridge and several large enamel murals in the Morse Elementary School; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family and friends of Juliet Kepes at this time of such personal loss and join in the spirit of celebrating her life; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Juliet's family on behalf of the entire City Council.
