

City of Cambridge.

In Board of Aldermen, Oct. 20 1865.

Whereas the City Council has heretofore agreed that, whenever Garden Street, between Lincoln Street and Wyeth Street, should be widened by the abutments, so as to be fifty feet in width, free from obstructions, the City would accept and grade the same, and would allow the sum of Three Hundred Dollars towards the payment of the expense of removing said obstructions, -

And Whereas the trees and buildings have been removed, and the owners have agreed to set back the fences as soon as the grade can be determined on which they shall be placed, and to claim no damages for the land so taken to make the street fifty feet in width, and and above said sum of Three Hundred Dollars to be paid as aforesaid, -

And Whereas it is adjudged by the Mayor and Aldermen that the public convenience and necessity require that said Garden Street be widened as aforesaid and that no person will be entitled to compensation from the City for land taken for

this purpose, except as aforesaid.

Therefore Ordered, That said Garden Street, between Lincoln and Wyeth Streets be widened, so as to be fifty feet in width, and that the same be laid out and established as a public highway, agreeably to a Plan thereof drawn by W. A. Adams, Surveyor, dated Sept. 21st 1865, and now before this Board,

Adopted and sent down for concurrence.
