- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge desires to recognize those persons who have performed extensive and patriotic public service unselfishly and with devotion; and
- WHEREAS: Bernard Rudolph, past Commander of Post 35 of Jewish War Veterans and Marion Rudolph, past President of the Women's Auxiliary of Post 35 of Jewish War Veterans, through their extraordinary leadership in matters concerning veterans from all walks of life and their generosity to the magnificent hospital program instituted by Post 35 to provide comfort and care for those veterans who have been hospitalized and with unstinting generosity and benevolence have set noble examples for our youth to follow by their display of patriotism and munificent public spirit in all concerns of the community; and
- WHEREAS: Both Bernard and Marion Rudolph have been chosen by their peers to hold high State Office in the organization of the Jewish War Veterans of the United States in recognition of their outstanding service in behalf of veterans and their dependents; and
- WHEREAS: Bernard Rudolph has served the City of Cambridge during his tenure as President of the Cambridge Veterans Organization with a clear determination that his native City should maintain its historic sites, such as Fort Washington, and by personally taking charge of and maintaining a flag over the Fort Washington site for many years without recompense; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Council of Cambridge recognizes that Bernard and Marion Rudolph have performed extensive and patriotic public service and that such recognition be made a part of the permanent records of this City Council; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mr. Rudolph on behalf of the entire City Council.
