WHEREAS: Nancy Shrom Dye is also a noted author and authority on American and social history, whose work includes, *As Equals and Sisters: Feminism, Unionism, and the Women's Trade Union League*, as well as numerous articles, book chapters, book reviews, and papers on topics related to women's history; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council join in extending a warm welcome to Nancy Shrom Dye on her first visit to Cambridge as President of Oberlin College and wish her very well in work as President of Oberlin College.
