Charles Pappas, liquor executive

Charles A. Pappas of Belmont, a philanthropist and executive in the liquor industry, died of heart disease Tuesday in Massachusetts General Hospital. He was 68.

Mr. Pappas was born in Cambridge and raised in Belmont. He attended Tufts University. After serving in the Army for two years, he became a stockbroker for Smith Barney Harris Upham and Co. Later, he joined the family business, C. Pappas Company, a wholesale liquor distributor in South Boston.

For the past 20 years, he was president of the Thomas A. Pappas Charitable Foundation. He also established the Bessie Pappas Charitable Foundation in memory of his mother.

Mr. Pappas was an avid golfer, and a member of the Belmont Country Club and the Breakers Club of Palm Beach, Fla.

He leaves his wife, Helen (Kalton); two daughters, Betsy Demirjian of Weston and Sophia of Watertown; and two sons, Thomas of Bourne and John of Burlington.

A funeral will be held at 10 a.m. tomorrow in Taxiarche Greek Orthodox Church in Watertown.
