William Phinney, school official; 80

A funeral Mass will be said tomorrow for William L. Phinney, a former assistant superintendent of schools in Quincy, who died Saturday at Brigham and Women's Hospital. He was 80.

Mr. Phinney was a lifelong resident of Quincy and a 1938 graduate of Quincy High School, where he was an all-scholastic athlete in football, basketball, and baseball.

He worked at the Fore River Shipyard before joining the Army Air Corps in 1942. He served in the Pacific during World War II.

He received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Boston University and took advanced studies at Harvard University.

He began teaching at a Newton junior high school in 1950. In 1957, he became assistant principal at newly opened Broad Meadows Junior High School in Quincy.

Two years later, he was appointed principal of the Adams School, where he instituted a non-graded Continuous Progress Program. He served in the Teach Corps as a team leader in Sierra Leone in West Africa in 1965.

In 1967, he was appointed elementary school coordinator in Quincy and became assistant superintendent for curriculum and instruction in 1969. He was selected as a Fulbright Scholar to study in India in 1974.

In addition to being a member of several national curriculum projects, Mr. Phinney was the leader of Quincy's effort to build the Student Centered Learning System. He also was selected by the Kettering Foundation as an outstanding educator. A longtime high school football coach in addition to his academic duties, he retired in 1982.

Mr. Phinney was a vice president of the Holy Name Society, a member of the New England Football Officials Association, the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development, and the New England Educational Re-
