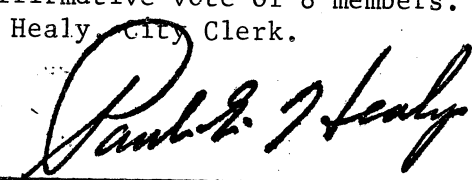
COUNCILLOR WALTER SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: The Cathedral of the Holy Cross on Thursday, March 22, 1984 was the site from which the Most Reverend Bernard Law, Boston's eighth spiritual leader in the past one hundred and seventy-six years, began his new role, attended by some two thousand priests, bishops and members of the religious community; and
- WHEREAS: This deeply religious man officially took charge of the third largest Catholic archdiocese at this ceremony, in which he requested the cooperation and loyalty of all the religious of the diocese; and
- WHEREAS: It is clear from the statements made by Archbishop Law that he intends to conduct an open ministry for all the people, while maintaining the long standing principles of the Church, principles upon which the Catholic Church is founded and ones which, under the new Archbishop's leadership shall indeed be fostered; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending a hearty welcome and sincere wish that the Archbishop have every possible blessing for good health as he begins his new role as Archbishop of Boston; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Archbishop Bernard Law on behalf of the entire City Council.
