COUNCILLOR D. SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: The Reagan Administration's policy is leading our nation into deepening involvement in military conflict in Central America; and
- WHEREAS: The domestic conflicts of Central American nations have stemmed mainly from repression and economic injustice; and
- WHEREAS: The government of El Salvador has failed to bring to account those responsible for the brutal murder of three American nuns and one lay worker; and
- WHEREAS: The citizens of Cambridge on November 3, 1981 voted 17,480 to 5,973 to oppose sending "U.S. troops, military advisors, arms or military aid of any kind to the governments of El Salvador, Honduras or Guatemala"; and
- WHEREAS: The Democratic City Committee of Cambridge on May 24, 1983 called for an end to United States military intervention in Central America; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council call upon the President and Congress of the United States to: (1) announce that no American troops will be sent to Central America; (2) cease all military involvement in El Salvador, Honduras, and Guatemala; (3) publicly denounce human rights violations and publicly emphasize the need for free elections in Central America; and (4) seek the assistance of and work with Mexico and our other allies in negotiating a peaceful resolution of the conflict in Central America; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk transmit certified copies of this resolution to President Reagan, Speaker O'Neill, and Senators Kennedy and Tsongas.

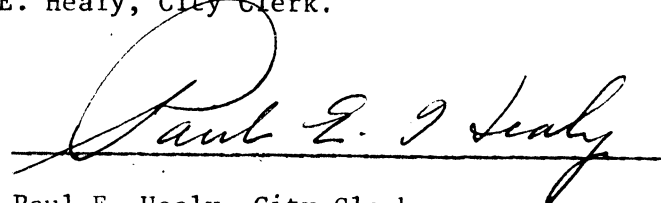
