MAYOR VELLUCCI

- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that before years end, Philip Mangano, Emergency Services Coordinator, will leave the employ of the City of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Phil, began with the Department of Human Service Programs in July, 1986, working primarily with individual casework which led to and coupled with existing community coalitions, the development of other networks of providers of services to the homeless; and
- WHEREAS: Phil assisted in the development of such initiatives as a meals program, individual and family shelters a furniture bank, and a specialized child care program at the Salvation Army, to cite only a few of the programs to meet the needs of the homeless; and
- WHEREAS: Working with the City Council, the City Manager, and other members of the city government, the Multiservice Center, which, collocates city staff, providing emergency casework and referrals and a host of other services for those in need, became a reality; and
- WHEREAS: Phil has been instrumental in securing private funds and donations in addition to the many fundraising events such as the James Taylor Concert to supplement city funds to assist the homeless; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deep appreciation to Philip Mangano for his efforts on behalf of those in the greatest need and wish him well in all future endeavors; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to Philip Mangano on behalf of the entire City Council.

Philip Mangano

- employed by the City of Cambridge, Department of Human Service Programs July 14, 1986, as Emergency Services Coordinator. Leaving the employ of the City before the end of 1989.
 - began his work primarily with individual casework.
 - worked with existing community coalitions, and was instrumental in the development of other networks of providers of services to the homeless.
 - identified and articulated needs of homeless persons, working with many governmental and private service providers to make available programs to meet these needs. Such initiatives include the development of meals programs, individual and family shelters, a furniture bank, a day program and specialized child care program at the Salvation Army, emergency casework, and rooms at the YWCA and YMCA, and assistance in securing permanent rental housing.
 - developed City commitments to open and operate the Multiservice Center, which collocates City staff providing emergency casework and referrals, Housing Search for homeless families and elderly housing services; a mental health social worker; Shelter, Inc. social worker; staff for the Teens in Transition Resource Center; the Furniture Bank Coordinator; outreach for Cambridge Hospital's Healthcare for the Homeless. The Center also provides a focal point for volunteer efforts, and for meetings involving other service providers.
 - was instrumental in bringing private resources to bear on many problems of homeless families and individuals, through work with private donors, foundations and trusts, and through fund-raising events such as the James Taylor Benefit Concert co-sponsored by Harvard University, the City of Cambridge, and St. Paul African Methodist Episcopal Church, with media sponsorship from WBZ-TV and the Boston Phoenix and many additional contributions from individual and business donors.
 - spearheaded successful efforts to obtain and apply State and federal funding resources to problems of homelessness in Cambridge.
 - plans to return to Cambridge after a brief sabbatical to pursue the next phase of the strategy to help the homeless by working with churches and non-profit agencies to develop new affordable housing for the poor.
