
Dear Mr. Libbits:

April 5, 1971

WHEREAS:

Rose O'Brien, a retired employee of the Hospital Department of the City of Cambridge entered the service of the Hospital Department on August 22, 1955 and was retired on January 31, 1971 having served not less than fifteen years

WHEREAS:

Rose O'Brien retired under the provisions of Chapter 32 Section 5 of the General Laws, which provides compulsory retirement at the age of seventy years, receiving as her retirement allowance the annual sum of \$813.84

ORDERED:

That under the provisions of Section 96 of Chapter 32 of the General Laws, Tercentenary Edition and amendments thereto, that an increase in retirement allowance be granted to Rose O'Brien from the sum of \$813.84 to \$1200.00 per year.

Dennis W. O'Brien, a former employee of the Police Department of the City of Cambridge, entered the service of the Police Department on August 6, 1912 and was pensioned on June 6, 1943 and died on March 17, 1973, having served not less than thirty-one years, and

WHEREAS:

At the time of his death said employee had no rights to elect that benefits be paid to his survivor, said employee leaves as his survivor, his widow, Mrs. Julia L. O'Brien, who has not remarried and is not receiving any retirement allowance or pension under the provisions of any general or special law, therefore be it

ORDERED:

That, under the provision of Section 95A of Chapter 32 of the General Laws, Tercentenary Edition and amendments thereto, that in order to promote the public good, and in consideration of the long and meritorious service performed by Dennis W. O'Brien, an annuity be granted to Mrs. Julia L. O'Brien, widow of Dennis W. O'Brien, of \$1200.00 per year.


