TO ALL PERSONS INTERESTED IN THE PRODUCTION, DISTRIBUTION AND CONSUMPTION OF MILK AND CREAM IN ANY AND ALL OF THE SEVERAL MILK MARKETING AREAS IN THE COMMONWEALTH, AND TO ALL OTHER PERSONS INTERESTED:

Notice is hereby given by the Massachusetts Milk Control Commission that, by virtue of the authority vested in it by General Laws Chapter 94A, and more especially pursuant to the provisions contained in Sections 2,5,9,10,11,23,24 and 25 thereof, it will hold a public hearing for all Milk Marketing Areas of the Commonwealth, as follows:

and thereafter at such times and places as the presiding officer may deem necessary for the purpose of receiving from all interested persons testimony and evidence pertinent to the following subjects and issues:

1. Whether or not the towns of Belchertown, Blandford, Chester, Chesterfield, Cummington, Goshen, Granby, Granville, Huntington, Middlefield, Montgomery, Pelham, Plainfield, Russell, Southampton, Southwick, Tolland, Westhampton and Worthington (all at present in Milk Marketing Area No. 5B; see Official Order No. G5-005, effective January 1, 1950) and the town of Hampden (presently in Milk Marketing Area No. 9E; see Official Order No. G9-007, effective September 1, 1960) constitute a part of the natural milk marketing area designated as Milk Marketing Area No. 6A (see Official Order No. G6-004, effective January 1, 1950).
2. Whether or not the town of Hubbardston (presently in Milk Marketing Area No. 7G; see Official Order No. G7-010, effective September 1, 1960), the towns of Brookfield and Oakham (both presently in Milk Marketing Area No. 9C; see Official Order No. G9-007, effective September 1, 1960) and the towns of Holland and Sturbridge (both presently in Milk Marketing Area No. 9E; see Official Order No. G9-007 as aforesaid) constitute a part of the natural milk marketing area designated as Milk Marketing Area No. 8 (See Official Order No. G8-006, effective September 1, 1960).
3. Whether or not the Commission should adopt any, and if so, what order or orders or amendments to order or orders relative to the subject matter of Items 1 and 2.
4. Whether or not the Commission should adopt an amendment to Official Order No. G-021, most recently amended effective May 1, 1968, to add Milk Marketing Area Nos. 5A, 7B and 10C in Section 1 (1) and (2) so that wherever it reads "6A, 8, 12, 13A, 13B, 15, 17 and 17B", it shall be amended to read "Milk Marketing Area Nos. 5A, 6A, 7B, 8, 10C, 12, 13A, 13B, 15, 17 and 17B."

5. Whether or not the Commission should adopt any, and if so, what amendment or amendments to Official Orders No. G5-269, G7-269, or G10C-269 as they pertain to Milk Marketing Areas Nos. 5A, 7B and 10C.

6. Whether or not the Commission should adopt any and if so, what amendment or amendments to Official Order No. G-F203 in Sections 1 and 2 by adding Milk Marketing Areas Nos. 5A, 7B and 10C, so that it would be amended to read, "Milk Marketing Areas Nos. 5A, 6A, 7B, 8, 10C, 12, 13A, 13B, 15, 17 and 17B," in said sections; and in Section 7 thereof to designate the Milk Marketing Area Orders currently in effect.

7. Whether or not the Commission should adopt any and if so, what amendment or amendments to Article IV, Section 3, Paragraph (1) of Official Order No. G-301, as most recently amended by Amendment No. 17, effective May 1, 1968. Said Paragraph (1) contains the formula to determine the price payable to producers for Class II milk sold, distributed, used or disposed of by milk dealers in various pertinent milk marketing areas.

8. Whether or not Article VIII, Section 3(b) of Official Order No. G-301, as last amended by Amendment No. 16, effective October 1, 1964, should be further amended by changing the factors in the determination of the butterfat differential.

9. Whether or not the Commission should adopt any, and if so, what order or orders or amendments to order or orders relative to the subject matter of Items Nos. 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8.

All persons desiring to be heard or to submit written statements or arguments, or to testify on any subject or matter specified in the hearing notice are hereby notified to appear at the above designated time and place. Copies of all of the above cited Official Orders may be obtained at the Commission's office.
