The Joint Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges, to which was referred the petition of John Davis and others, praying for the acceptance of Walnut Avenue, so-called between Arlington street and Lambert Avenue, would herewith
Report,

Recommending that the prayer of said petitioners be granted in accordance with the terms of their petition, whenever they shall have furnished a plan and profile of the same, showing said Avenue to be seventy feet wide, with forty feet roadway and fifteen feet on each side of said roadway, one-half of which; - to wit the width of seven and one-half feet, shall be graded as a sidewalk and the other seven and one-half feet in width, being the part constituting the strip between said sidewalk and roadway, shall be allowed to remain with a uniform and proper grade as a lawn.

The said petitioners also to sign a proper release
to the city of the entire seventy feet as hereinbefore
named for the width of said street, and the same to
be free from all encroachments and graded to the
satisfaction of the Committee on Road & Bridges on the
part of this board.
