Section 11 of the Order creating the Mid-Cambridge Neighborhood Conservation District states that continuation of the designation for an additional period of years shall require an affirmative vote of the City Council prior to the expiration of the initial two year designation of the district. The Mid-Cambridge Neighborhood Conservation District Commission has been in effect since July 1, 1985 and the initial period of designation will expire on July 1, 1987.
