

City of Cambridge.

In Board of Aldermen, Oct. 29, 1862

Ordered, Whereas it is adjudged by this Board that the public convenience and necessity require that Brighton Street, between Howard Square and ill. Auburn Street, should be widened on the North westerly side, so as to make said Brighton Street forty feet in width, as shown on the Plan of Brighton Street drawn by W. A. Mason, Surveyor, dated 1854, and now on file in the office of the City Clerk, Vol. 24 of Street Plans. Page 74. - and according to the red lines on said Plan: therefore

Ordered, That said Brighton Street be so widened, and that so much of the land of William Read, daughter of P. Gregory, Susan Maria Porter, the Heirs of Joseph Porter, and ^{any other} person, or persons, as is included between the present ^{North westerly} line of Brighton Street and the red line on said Plan ^{as representing} the distance of forty feet from the South Easterly line of said street, be and is hereby laid out and established as a part of said Brighton Street and a public highway

Ordered, That damages for the land so taken and laid out as a part of said

Brighton Street, be estimated and awarded
as follows:-

" Martha P. Gregory - the sum of \$1400 -

" Susan Maria Porter

" Heirs of Joseph Porter

} the sum of \$1500
