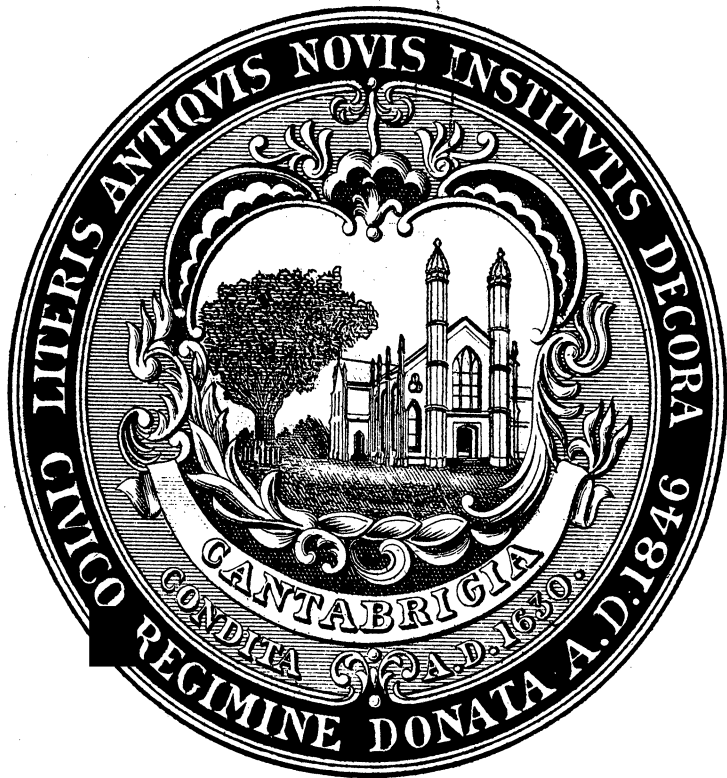

IN CITY COUNCIL
December 13, 1982

- WHEREAS: The Cambridge City Council has in numerous resolutions, taken an active, leadership role in proclaiming its concern about the threat of nuclear war, the nuclear arms race, and the role of local government in protecting its citizens from nuclear war; and
- WHEREAS: Its namesake city, Cambridge, England has indicated an interest in "twinning" with Cambridge, Massachusetts for the purposes of coordination and communication in disarmament activities; and had adopted by resolution on November 25, 1982 the brochure "Cambridge and Nuclear Weapons" based on a similar brochure adopted by the Cambridge, Massachusetts City Council on September 18, 1981. Cambridge, England along with 141 other local authorities has proclaimed itself a "nuclear free zone; and
- WHEREAS: The City Councillors in Cambridge, England have requested a copy of the seal of the City of Cambridge, Massachusetts for purposes of designing a symbol expressing the "disarmament twinning" to be displayed on the front of the Guildhall in Cambridge, England; and
- WHEREAS: A large national demonstration is being held December 11 and 12, 1982 at the Greenham Common American Airforce Base to protest the schedule deployment of American Cruise missiles at that site; therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the Cambridge City Council indicate its enthusiastic interest in "disarmament twinning" for the purposes of coordination and communication of disarmament and peace education activities; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Council express its gratitude that its brochure was the inspiration of the similar brochure "Cambridge and Nuclear Weapons" newly adopted in Cambridge, England for mailing to all of the residents of the English city; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Council expresses its support of the "nuclear free zone" campaign legislated in Cambridge, England and 141 other local authorities in the United Kingdom and its belief that the nuclear freeze campaign adopted by many local authorities and nine states in the United States may assist the British "nuclear free zone" campaign in realizing its goals of achieving a "nuclear free" British Isles; and be it further

ORDERED:

That the City Council directs that the seal of the City of Cambridge, Massachusetts may be employed on the outside of the Guildhall in Cambridge, England and in other official presentations of the City in a symbol expressing the disarmament "twinning" of the two cities, the design showing the Cambridge, Massachusetts seal be submitted for prior approval of the City Council here; and be it further

ORDERED:

That a telegram of support for the December 11 and 12, 1982 action be sent immediately to the Greenbaum Common disarmers and a copy be sent to Monsignor Bruce Kent, General Secretary of the Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament, who visited the Mayor of Cambridge, Massachusetts in the Spring, 1982 and that the telegram should read:

"The City Council of Cambridge, Massachusetts supports the disarmament action at Greenhaum Common. We command your heroism and dedication to the cause of peace. We stand in solidarity with you."

and be it further

ORDERED:

That a copy of this resolution be sent to Mayor Peter Cowell, The Guildhall, Cambridge, England.
