COUNCILLOR WALSH

- WHEREAS: The M.D.C. has indicated that budget restraints are the reason that the Gore Street Skating Rink will not open until the week before Thanksgiving, with the result that between 125 and 150 Cambridge youngsters, with the guidance of very concerned and caring adults, are presently forced to pay \$110 per hour to use the skating rink at Boston University for several hours on several evenings each week; and
- WHEREAS: A request by the group to use the skating rinks at both Harvard University and Massachusetts Institute of Technology was turned down; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to confer with appropriate administrators at Harvard, Massachusetts Institute of Technology and Buckingham, Browne and Nichols to explore the possibility that the institutions would offer pro bono use of their skating rinks for two or three hours on several evenings each week as a good neighbor response to the needs of neighborhood youth who, through no fault of their own, are caught in the crossfire as victims of the state's fiscal crisis; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to report back to this City Council on October 2, 1989 to advise what the response was from Harvard, Massachusetts Institute of Technology and Buckingham, Browne and Nichols.
