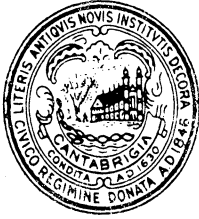

I do hereby transmit for your approval grant award in the amount of \$27,790.00 for the Governor's Committee on Law Enforcement and Administration of Justice for the creation and operation of a Planning and Research Division with the Cambridge Police Department.

This grant award is in response to this Administration's objective to enhance the management capability of the Chief of Police and is consistent with our overall criminal justice-crime prevention plan. As outlined in the attached application the chief objectives of the Planning and Research Unit are:


1. to provide the Department with an internal planning capability with respect to short term and long range planning needs and priorities.

This grant award is yet another step in this administration's determined effort to increase the management capability in the Police Department resulting in more efficient and effective service to our citizens.
