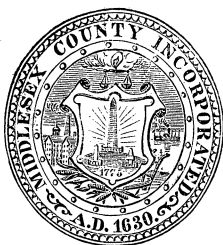


# Commonwealth of Massachusetts.



MIDDLESEX, SS.

Cambridge, December 15, 1871.

By the County Commissioners.

On the Petition of John Bottume, Jr., and others to lay out a highway in Medford and Somerville, crossing Mystic River, said Commissioners being authorized and empowered to do so by the Legislature of Massachusetts, in the year 1869, ch. 187.

It is hereby

*Ordered*, That an adjourned meeting of the said Middlesex County Commissioners be held in their room in the Court House, in Cambridge, on Saturday, December 23d, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, for the purpose, under said Act, Sec. 2d, of apportioning and assessing "upon said County, and such cities and towns, and in such manner and amount, as they shall deem equitable and just, the cost of construction and maintenance of such road, bridge and draw," — and the cities of Charlestown, and Cambridge, and the towns of Malden, Everett, Somerville, Medford, Winchester, Melrose, Stoneham, Wakefield, Woburn and Reading, are invited and requested to be present at that meeting, to give such evidence as they may have, and as may guide the said Commissioners in apportioning and making said assessments.
