- WHEREAS:** Complaints have been received that motor vehicle operators are paying little or no attention to the presence of the crosswalk markings at the intersection of Franklin and River Streets thereby endangering pedestrians and presenting an ongoing special hazard to neighboring residents and especially Senior Citizens at Manning Apartments; now therefore be it
- ORDERED:** That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to directed the Director of Traffic and Parking to arrange for installation of STOP signs and/or highly visible signs which will indicate both the presence of the crosswalk and the right of way possessed by pedestrians to utilize it, at the intersection of Franklin Street and River Streets; and be it further
- ORDERED:** That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to direct the Chief of Police to take the steps necessary to effect compliance by vehicle operators with the rules of the road in this area; and be it further
- ORDERED:** That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to report back to this City Council by October 2, 1989 to confirm that this has been done and to advise as to how long it will be before the requested signs will have been installed.
