Notice has been received from His Honor, the Mayor, of the death on June 18, 1940 of John C. Haverty, Principal Assessor, for the City of Cambridge, it is fitting and proper that notice be taken of the sad event.

Born in Maine, " Jack " as he was known to everyone, came to our city at an early age and remained here during the rest of his lifetime. In his younger days he was prominent in athletics and served as President of the Cambridgeport Gymnasium. Always active and keenly interested in the affairs of St. Mary's parish, he later became President of St. Mary's Catholic Association.

After serving as assistant assessor for several years, Mr. Haverty in 1915 was elected Principal Assessor and to this position he has been re-elected ever since. Despite his busy career as a city official, as well as being engaged in the real estate business, he always found time to devote to various civic enterprises thruout the state. He was especially talented as an entertainer and a Minstrel Show in the City of Cambridge for a number of years wuld not be complete without " Jack " as an end man. Always such an outstanding success in affairs of this kind many thought he should have followed the stage as a career.

Warm-hearted, humorous, kindly and understanding, Jack was truly a man with hundreds of friends and not a single enemy. He was one of those persons whom everyone, both young and old, loved and admired, and no one could come into his presence without feeling his extreme friendliness. His passing is greatly felt thruout the city, Now therefore be it

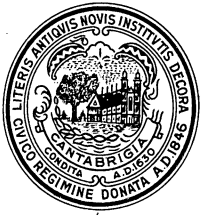
